The <u>Ukraine Family Scheme (https://www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-a-ukraine-family-scheme-visa)</u> allows applicants to join family members or extend their stay in the UK.

The <u>Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme (https://www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-a-visa-under-the-ukraine-sponsorship-scheme)</u> allows Ukrainian nationals and their family members to come to the UK if they have a named sponsor under the Homes for Ukraine Scheme.

The <u>Ukraine Extension Scheme (https://www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-to-stay-in-the-uk-under-the-ukraine-extension-scheme)</u> allows Ukrainian nationals and their immediate family members to apply for permission to stay in the UK. They can apply if one of the following is true:

- they held permission to be in the UK on or between 18 March 2022 and 16 May 2023 – the permission does not need to cover the whole period
- they previously held permission to be in the UK and that permission expired on or after 1 January 2022

Statistics on Ukrainians in the UK (https://www.gov.uk/government/statistics/immigration-system-statistics-year-ending-december-2022/statistics-on-ukrainians-in-the-uk) published by the Home Office as part of the latest quarterly Immigration System Statistics release, brings together the data from the new visa schemes for Ukrainians alongside visas issued on other routes, arrivals on the Ukraine Schemes, the Extension Scheme and asylum applications.

Notes

- 1. Figures are provisional management information from live operational systems drawn on the date of reporting, and are subject to change.
- 2. All figures are rounded to the nearest 10 or 100, and individual figures may not add up to totals due to rounding.
- 3. Ukraine Family Scheme figures are from 4 March 2022 onwards, when this Scheme launched. Visas issued under the Ukrainian Fee Waiver Family Concession, which was in place for a short time before the launch of the Family Scheme, are also included.
- 4. Figures for in-UK applications to the Family Scheme are from 11 March 2022 onwards.
- 5. Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme figures are from 18 March 2022 onwards, when this Scheme launched.
- 6. Ukraine Extension Scheme figures are from 3 May 2022, when the Scheme launched.
- 7. Applications received are based on confirmed applications, which are usually those where the applicant has applied and provided biometric information. Some applicants to the Family Scheme and Sponsorship Scheme are able to defer their provision of biometric information until after their arrival in the UK.
- 8. Withdrawn applications include those where an applicant has applied more than once and only one of their applications is considered, leaving the others discounted from processing. It also includes those applying via routes that allow deferral of biometric provision but then did not progress it by providing all information required to complete the application. Note that in both cases this effectively means that the number of confirmed applications includes those that cannot be progressed; in the

latter case the application is only confirmed (and reported as such in the data) at the point it is also withdrawn.

- 9. Refusals relate to applications that have been made by third country nationals who have applied to the Ukraine Schemes but do not qualify.
- 10. Applications awaiting conclusion include applications at various stages of the caseworking process and differing levels of complexity.
- 11. Arrival figures represent visa holders who have been positively identified as arriving in the UK through matching visa information to travel and border crossing records. This method may not detect all arrivals and is subject to ongoing refinement.
- 12. The frequency of releasing this information will be kept under review.
- 13.
