Legal Aid Bill

The Legal Aid, Sentencing and Punishment of Offenders Bill is nearing its final stages of consideration in the House of Lords. On 5 and 7 March 2012 the Lords will be debating the legal aid aspects of this Bill, which will be one of the last chances to make changes before the Bill is passed. The Government has recently amended the Bill so that in future the UK Border Agency may consider all spent (as well as unspent) criminal convictions in making decisions on a person's immigration status.
